ITIL® Service Design (SD) (Intermediate Lifecycle)

The ITIL Intermediate Qualification: Service Design Certificate is a free-standing qualification, but is also part of the ITIL Intermediate Lifecycle stream, and one of the modules that leads to the ITIL Expert Certificate in IT Service Management.

The purpose of this training module and the associated exam and certificate is, respectively, to impart, test, and validate the knowledge on industry practices in service management as documented in the *ITIL Service Design* publication.

The course syllabus covers the management-level concepts and core information of the activities and techniques within service design, but not specific details about each of the supporting processes.
